#### Summer of Love

Grace and peace to you! My name is Amy Vigesaa and I am the new Pastoral Intern at Family of Christ. I am so pleased to be here. Thank you for inviting me into your congregation as a learner and as a fellow disciple of Christ. Please reach out, I'd love to get to know you and chat for a while.

This month's worship series is "Summer of Love" and we're focusing on 1 John 4:8 which says, "Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love." To flip that to the positive, the verse before this tells us whoever loves, knows God for God is love. To sum up: if we love, we know God. If we don't love, we don't know God. Why? Because God is love itself, therefore love can't happen without God. A song I know shares this really well. It's by Chris Renzema and it's titled "God is Love."

Love can be complicated. But it helps to remember that God meets us in and through each other. I've seen it and I'm sure you have too. I've seen it in people celebrating with one another. I've seen it when people bring meals to someone just out of the hospital. I see it here in how you welcomed me on my first day. Sometimes we don't know how to love each other well and other times it seems like the easiest thing in the world. But whatever love we give or receive, it is a way to grow closer to God and know God better. We have a beautiful example of how to love in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Jesus loved the unlovable, the unreachable, the untouchable, the unclean. Jesus went into people's homes and into their lives. He ate with them, listened to them and loved them. We can do the same because Christ lives in us and through the Holy Spirit moves us to love our neighbor; to love that hard-to-love family member or co-worker; to love our kids better; to love that person different from us. "Love one another as I have loved you," Jesus commands. I can't wait to do this together. May God increase our love!
