Message from Pastor

The End is Just the Beginning

For the last few weeks, we've been looking at the journey and not the destination of Easter. As we approach the empty tomb, there's something else that is part of this story. It's the real reality that it doesn't come to an end.

One of my favorite musicals is Stephen Sondheim's *Into the Woods*. The first act is fairy tales that most of us grew up with and it ends with "Happily Ever After!" But it's only half over. The second act is about what comes next and all the messiness of life that leads to a true ever after. In many ways, that's like the life that we lead. The first act of our story is the wonderful gift of Easter, where we realize that the path we travel does not at the end with death. As the women approach the tomb on that Easter morning, expecting to care for Jesus's body, he's not there. Their expectations are that their journey will end at the grave, but God makes it "to be continued."

Part of our human tendency is to seek milestones or arrival points throughout our lives. We feel we need to arrive in this life because death seems like such an ending point. However, this life is not all there is. Through the resurrected Jesus there is new and eternal life beyond the here and now. This is a source of hope in the messy and painful parts of our lives. Consider how God kept showing up for God's people in Egypt, the wilderness, the exile, In the life of Jesus, and now in us.

But if the resurrection isn't the end of our story, what's our next chapter? What if this is just a new beginning? If death is not our final arrival, if Jesus lives and so do we, then let's get moving. We got a lot of living to do, so let's get started.

Are We There Yet? Lent and Easter Worship

Do you ever feel like if you just make it over the next hurdle or reach your next goal that you will have finally arrived in life? Many people do, including our Biblical friends, but guess what? That's called the arrival fallacy, and it can keep us feeling disappointed and unhappy when we get to the "next thing" and find we still haven't arrived at our hoped-for destination. We are still unfailingly human, flawed, broken.



This Lent and Easter, let us learn to savor our uniquely human journey without the pressure of arrival, as we reconnect with the God of Jesus Christ who leads us in the way, providing sustenance, meaning, and hope through all our ups and downs.

March 30th No Going Back | Ezra 3:10-13

Sometimes we think that everything will be fine if we can just go back to the way things were, but the present will never be the past. The good news is that God is in what was, what is, and what will be.

April 6th The Fake Out | John 2:13-25

Just when we think we have it all figured out – the right job, the right routine, the right way of doing things – Jesus comes in and upends our certainty, always moving us into deeper truth, justice, and relationship.

April 13th (Palm/Passion Sunday): Staying Power | Luke 19:28-40

Everyone loves a parade but what happens when the party is over? Real hope is built in daily acts of showing up – in times of celebration, in times of challenge, and in the ordinary in-between.

April 17th Holy/Maundy Thursday: Detour Ahead | John 13:1-17, 33-35

The disciples thought they knew where they were going but Jesus says, "Where I am going, you cannot come." Instead, he gives them instructions for a detour, "Love one another." How do we love one another on the roadway to God?

April 18th Good Friday: Holding On When the Cross Feels Final | Matthew 26 & 27 Jesus' cross feels like the worst kind of arrival; it bears the finality of death. When "arriving" means there is nowhere left to go, Jesus remains with us holding the promise that even this is not our final stop.

Easter Sunday: Setting Out Again | Matthew 28:1-10, 16-20

Death is not our final arrival. Jesus lives and so do we. He sends us out on the journey anew and promises to be with us the whole way.



Holy Humor Sunday, May 11th Easter is a Laughing Matter

Join us for a service of laughter and fun celebrating the eternal joke that God pulled on Satan in the resurrection. Satan thought he had won the battle by defeating Jesus in death on the cross, but Jesus rose from the dead, winning the ultimate victory, having the last laugh.






Interested in Membership at Family of Christ?


First Communion Class




