Dr David Schultz is a political science professor at Hamline University and is seen regularly on local news stations.

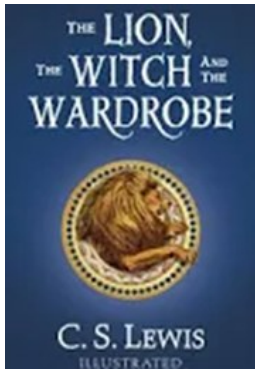
