

Join us on Sunday, October 6th as Family of Christ will observe Tanzania Sunday.



Secondary Student Scholarships

Since 2004, FOC members and friends have sponsored 401 Usokami secondary students. During the current school year there are a total of (14) secondary school age students, including (5) boys and (9) girls who are supported by Family of Christ. Providing scholarship support for these students is a great investment toward a brighter future for them, their community, Tanzania, and Africa. According to UNICEF, Tanzania has significantly expanded school enrolment in recent years, especially among girls. However, 3.2 million children aged 7–17 are out of school, of which 1.2 million have never attended. The net secondary enrolment rate is only 27%. Rural and poor girls are the most affected with higher dropout rates starting at age 12.

The 2025 FOC scholarship goal is again to raise \$8400 which covers the cost of room, board and education (\$615) for an entire year for those attending Lutheran private schools (100% of current FOC sponsored students) and to increase the number of sponsored students. Any size donation will help reach the new \$8400 financial goal and is such a generous gift.

Scholarship donations are due by October 27



Iringa Hope Micro-Finance Project

In 2019 We began to partner with Iringa Hope, an organization that raises funds fand administrates microfiniance loans. **Iringa Hope** uses a unique model to deliver agricultural financing, marketing, and training to smallholder farmers in Tanzania. The organization develops self-governed and self-sustaining member owned and operated cooperative societies that help to alleviate poverty and empower entrepreneurs. Microfinance loans are made to small businesses and farms with an average loan of \$300. The repayment rate of the loans is 98% so our donations continue be loaned out year

- Keneth Temba who is in his final year of a 3-year of an Optometry diploma program at the MVUMI Institute of Health Science. With his completed studies in 2025, he will test patients for Visual Acuity and prescribe corrective lens at the Ilula Hospital.
- Justice Bwisco who is in his 3rd year of a 4-year radiography training at Makerere University in Uganda and will return to the Ilula Hospital after completion of his studies.
