Message from Pastor

Ordinary Faith

Well, we are firmly in the throes of a new year and for the next couple of months as we weather the cold and dark life gets a bit, well, ordinary and in worship we are in such a time. Ordinary Time in the church year is more than marking time between Christmas and Easter. It is a way of walking with Jesus and growing into our faith as we are making and being made into disciples. Since we aren't planning for big festivities in our lives or the world, these next few weeks we invite you to join us and to look at where you are – as individuals and as a community. Jesus and His journey into ministry is something for us to take some time with, because just as Jesus built foundations for life we too need to go back and secure our own cornerstones.

Community Potluck Dinner and Game Night Saturday, February 22nd


Come one, come all to an All-Ages Game Night at Family of Christ for fellowship and fun.
