Message from Pastor

Summer is upon us and with it the chance to take a break and relax. This is the time when some of us slow down a bit and take vacations, concentrate on projects, go to reunions and graduations, read lighthearted books and escape for a while. I spent last week at a retreat center learning to connect with nature not through lecture but being guided into communion with it. It's amazing what you learn about the earth, God, and yourself by simply being in a small space for a long period of time. Yet something seems to be different this year. Summer, which for some of us is a time to escape and recharge, seems to be a bit heavier with the weights of our lives and the world around us. The escape doesn't seem to do it like it used to.

Often, we want things to be simple, cut and dry, but the reality is that life is messy, complicated and hard. We use the word "escape" to talk about trips and experiences but that seems to assume our lives are some sort of a prison. Sometimes it feels that way. My struggle is that I've been trying to escape from "what is" for so long that I forget that the "what is" is where I live my life and always get to return to. Whether I like it or not, my life is my life.

What if we decided to embrace our lives as they are and not what they could be? That's what God does for us in Jesus. As much as the Gospel story is about death and resurrection and the promise we will go to heaven when we die, Jesus gives us a way to live now in a different way. It's not an abandonment of our current reality, but more of seeing it in a different way. It's like when Jesus calls the fishermen, he says from now on you will be fishing for people. He doesn't fix their lives but helps them to see their lives differently. That instead of being steeped in the anger, hopelessness, fear, or numbness of a life we want to change, we find ways to acknowledge life as it is, see it as a place we are called to be and realize we have a part to play that is outside our comfort and bigger than we can imagine. The good news is that we have a community and a God that is willing to engage with us in life wherever we may be.

In a world that we cannot escape from, I invite you to join us as we hear some of those promises and begin to see that what we are seeking for isn't always somewhere else, but in us, and in a God and community that we do life with. Join us Sundays in-person or online as we look at some confusing Bible stories that can speak to us in new ways. Participate in one of our community nights as we gather to eat, worship, play and learn to live together. Find ways to see yourself as a gift and important to Family of Christ as our new ministry coordinator, Brita, has conversations with each of you about being a part of ministry and service. Join our new Fix-it team or find ways to get involved with worship and outreach. July Mission of the Month Dignity for Daughters (DfD)

Dignity for Daughters (DfD) mission is to achieve menstrual equity in Iringa, Tanzania. Sustainability will be accomplished through reproductive health education and ensuring reusable menstrual product availability by establishing local sewing ventures.

Only 1 in 5 girls in Iringa, Tanzania have access to formal menstrual health products, causing up to 5 missed days of school every month. We are dedicated to providing girls and boys with a



curriculum that is otherwise absent in secondary education in Iringa. Students are also equipped with reusable pads to help them manage their health with dignity and not miss valuable days of school. We aim to empower young people with the knowledge and resources they need to break the cycle of poverty and build a healthier, brighter future.
